Interaction with the Deaf Community

You cannot attend the same social more than once. You can, however, attend similar types of interacts (i.e. Starbucks in Roseville and It's a Grind in Elk Grove). No extension on due dates will be given.

If there are no Deaf persons in attendance, you can still count this as an interaction. Describe the event you attended and briefly research why Deaf interactions are important for the Deaf Community. Follow the other parts of the paper listed below.

Your cover page should have:

- o Your name
- o Class Name and Time
- o Date
- o Which interaction (i.e. Deaf Interaction 2 of 4)
- o List all interactions that you have attended this semester.

Your 1 – 2 page report should include:

- Name of the event, interaction, or topic of lecture.
- Setting: time and place of interaction.
- Attach proof of attendance (minus 20 points without proof stapled to paper) o Proof must be authentic.
 - o Proof is not a coffee warmer from Starbucks!!
 - o If you go to Bingo or Dingo, you must bring the paid receipt, not the bingo sheet!
- Describe the event.
 - o Briefly describe what transpired.
 - o Did you participate in the interaction? Why or why not?
 - o What did you enjoy about the interaction? Why?
 - o What did you not enjoy about the interaction? Why?
 - $o\ \mbox{In what respect or aspect was ASL used in or during the interaction?}$
 - How much of the conversation was discerned from body language and/or facial expressions? Explain.
 - o How much signing was employed as opposed to voiced English and/or lip-reading? Explain.
